



RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there is in effect an agreement between the U. S. National Park Service and the Bureau of Indian Affairs whereby the National Park Service will provide technical assistance in the field of Outdoor Recreation planning, and
- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is a prime outdoor recreation area now attracting approximately one million visitor use days annually, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is desirous of developing and maintaining its outdoor recreation facilities in the best manner possible.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby requests that the National Park Service provide as much technical planning assistance as possible to this Reservation in order to expedite development of its outdoor recreation resources provided that such technical services are gratuitous.

The foregoing resolution was on September 3, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
