

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Health, Education and Welfare Committee of the Tribal Council has recommended a mental health program be carried out on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Northern Arizona Comprehensive Guidance Center has applied for a grant from the Department of Education and Welfare to carry out a mental health survey, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Health, Education and Welfare Committee has requested that the Tribe contract with Northern Arizona Comprehensive Guidance Center to carry out the mental health survey and to establish a mental health program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council unanimously endorses the proposal of Northern Arizona Comprehensive Guidance Center and hereby directs the Tribal Chairman to sign any and all documents including, but without limitation, a contract agreement with Northern Arizona Comprehensive Guidance Center and/or the Department of Health, Education and Welfare to carry out a mental health program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on September 4, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
