


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, Comprehensive Health Programs being administered to Indian people by Indian Health Services to be more effective and more meaningful must have the total Indian participation and involvement, and
- WHEREAS, this Indian participation involvement has now been accomplished by the organization and operation of local Indian Health Advisory Boards, and
- WHEREAS, the Phoenix Indian Health Sdvisory Board is a true area-wide representative spokesmen for the Tribal Councils, Tribal officials and tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the effectiveness and useness of the Area Advisory Board depends upon the authority vested in it by tribal councils within the Phoenix Indian Health area, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is within the Phoenix Indian Health area.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council supports and ratifies the Constitution By-Laws of the Phoenix Indian Health Advisory Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Mr. William R. Rhodes, Office of Indian Tribal Affairs, Phoenix Area Advisory Board, 801 East Indian School Road, Phoenix, Arizona 85014.

The foregoing resolution was on November 5, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
