

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there are many crimes committed by non-Indians on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the U. S. Attorney's Office refuses to prosecute many of these crimes, and

WHEREAS, if there were a U. S. Commissioner's Office established on or near the reservation, these persons committing these crimes would receive their just punishment.

BE IT RESOLVED that our Congressional Delegation be requested to establish a U. S. Commissioner's Office on or near the reservation.

The Foregoing resolution was on November 5, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
