

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Committee on Indian 4-C programs of the Office of Child Development of the Health, Education and Welfare Department is in the process of selecting an Indian Community for a pilot Community Coordinated Child Care program which represents a Federally Initiated effort to assure a comprehensive approach to providing quality child development services for children and families, and

WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Indian Reservation represents an Indian Community which is all or part of an Indian Reservation under Federal trust and has Bureau of Indian Affairs and Indian Head Start child care services, and

WHEREAS, the Indian population through its elected representatives of the Tribal Council is in a decision-making position relative to developing community coordinated child care.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe as a community, express its desire to conduct an Indian Community Coordinated Child Care Program and that the Tribal Chairman be designated to express the Tribe's interest in a letter to the Office of Child Development, Department of Health, Education and Welfare.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe as a community constitute a Steering Committee and secure a written agreement by participating members of the Steering Committee that:

- a. It will develop a plan for the division of responsibility concerning areas and groups to be served by each of the participating member agencies and that
- b. It will agree to coordinate program matters, administrative procedures and staff activities,

as outlined in the criteria for selection of the Indian 4-C Pilot Community.

The foregoing resolution was on January 7, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
