

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mr. Garland Gordon, Area Liaison Officer between the U. S. Park Service and the Bureau of Indian Affairs Area Office, presented to the Tribe an archaeological program whereby the Tribe would cooperate with and become a party to the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the National Park Service pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding between the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the National Park Service (1963, and

WHEREAS, this action would preserve many of the archaeological sites.

BE IT RESOLVED that permission is hereby granted to the Phoenix Area Office and the National Park Service and the Liaison Officer is hereby granted permission to inspect all sites of proposed roads and/or any other large excavation projects in order to preserve or salvage whatever possible historical and archaeological sites.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency is hereby directed to request such services as needed.

The foregoing resolution was on June 3, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
