

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it has become extremely difficult to harvest Christmas trees due to inclement weather during the period when they should be harvested, and

WHEREAS, the wholesale of Christmas trees has not proven very profitable to the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, harvests are usually carried out along the roads having an ill-effect on esthetics, and

WHEREAS, the Forestry Committee has recommended no large contract for Christmas trees be made and it be replaced with a retail sale only, covered by permits to the White Mountain Apache Enterprises.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that no contract will be let for Christmas trees on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for 1970 and that permits be issued to the White Mountain Apache Enterprises to cover retail sales, as needed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that non-tribal members working on the Reservation may buy a permit to cut a Christmas tree for their own use at a rate of \$1.00 per tree up to eight feet high and 25¢ per foot over eight feet.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all institutions such as churches, schools and hospitals on the Reservation may obtain a free use permit. Other free use permits must be approved by the Tribal Chairman.

The foregoing resolution was on November 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
