

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 70-108, the Council authorized the Chairman to sign a standard twenty-five year lease with Harward Peddie covering the land between Whiteriver Service Station and the Econ-O-Wash, said land to be used to construct a Service Station and Garage thereon, and

WHEREAS, this resolution was later rescinded, and


WHEREAS, the Council again voted to grant a lease of the same land to Mr. Harward Peddie.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman is authorized to sign a standard twenty-five year lease for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe with Mr. Harward Peddie covering the land between the Whiteriver Service Station and Econ-O-Wash.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the land be appraised in order to arrive at the fair minimum annual rental therefrom.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that before the lease is executed, a metes and bounds description of the premises and a plat where the building is to be constructed must be presented to the Chairman of the Tribal Council for his approval.

The foregoing resolution was on January 6, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for 4 against, and 1 abstained by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to lauthority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
