

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, that additional responsibilities have been delegated to the Health, Education, and Welfare Committee Chairman by the Tribal Council, entailing wide jurisdiction over the three important Departments, i.e. Health, Education, and Welfare to the benefit of all tribal members, and

WHEREAS, programs under these said Departments require constant field work, such as, overseeing the Community Health Representative Program, tuberculosis control, mental health, and other related health programs under Public Health Service, and

WHEREAS, similar field work is required in order to efficiently operate Title I Projects and other related Educational Programs under the Bureau of Indian Affairs-requiring periodic upgrading and evaluation, and

WHEREAS, programs under Social Services Department also require similar consideration in field work such as, Tribal Work Experience Program and other related Welfare Programs under the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and

WHEREAS, transportation for the said Health, Education, and Welfare Committee Chairman is essential in other related programs directorship he assumes, i.e.

(1) Deputy Director of Community Action Program,

(2) Sub-Director of Operation Mainstream, and
Neighborhood Youth Corps under Indian Development
District of Arizona, and

WHEREAS, other obligations delegated to the said Health, Education, and Welfare Committee Chairman by the Tribal Council does require transportation to fulfill additional duties in Chairmanship of the Forestry and Apache Culture Committees, and

WHEREAS, the Health, Education, and Welfare Committee Chairman attends periodic meetings required of him as being duly authorized member of the Phoenix Area Indian Health Advisory Board and the Phoenix Area School Board.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council on the third day of February 1971 that the used Tribal vehicle (1969 Ford Model, four-door, two tone color) be transferred to the said Health, Education and Welfare Committee Chairman immediately and furthermore, that approximately \$3,000.00 per annum be set aside for operational cost of the vehicle.

The foregoing resolution was on February 3, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 28, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 stat. 984).
