

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, permission has been granted by Galbraith and Company of McNary, Arizona to hookup the ten mutual self-help houses at the McNary village, and


WHEREAS, the construction of the ten housing units has been held up pending the permission granted, and


WHEREAS, there is a dire need to complete the ten houses.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority and the U.S. Public Health Service proceed with the construction of the ten homes and the proposed water hookups for the ten homes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe reaffirm the action taken in March 1969 requesting U.S. Public Health Service to utilize the 121 Program, that planning and action be continued to satisfy the needs of the total Indian community at McNary by additional planning and additional programs for housing.

The foregoing resolution was on March 3, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
