

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, a society as diverse and complex as the White Mountain Apache Tribe should have a comprehensive development plan to guide it in future economic, social and physical development efforts, and

WHEREAS, such a plan, in six volumes, has been developed for the Tribe, through Section 701 of the Housing Act of 1954, and


WHEREAS, said plan appears to be comprehensive and generally suitable as a guide for development,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council accepts and adopts the "701" study as the official "master plan" for development of the Reservation and its resources.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the chairman of the council is directed to take necessary action to implement the plan, to assign responsibilities to the various offices and departments, and to develop procedures which will assure systematic and orderly revision, review, and utilization of the plan.

The foregoing resolution was on March 3, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
