

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it has been reported to the Tribal Council by the Land Board that the McNary Dump (community) is unsanitary, and

WHEREAS, the McNary Dump is polluting Gooseberry Creek and the lower Reservation waters, and


WHEREAS, it is necessary to eliminate pollution of our streams wherever possible, and


WHEREAS, the McNary Dump is considered a hazard to the health of Reservation residents and needs immediate correction

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Land Board and the Agency Office are directed to relocate the McNary Dump in an area satisfactory to the livestock interests of the area and meet the requirements of the lease to Southwest Forest Industries.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this action of relocation take place at the earliest possible time and that the old dump be closed and adequately posted or protected to prevent further use.

The foregoing resolution was on March 3, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
