WHEREAS, the Tribe is presently losing considerable timber to the spruce bark beetle and


WHEREAS, the U.S. Forest Service has requested that they be permitted to conduct two pilot spruce bark beetle control projects on the reservation and

WHEREAS, this study could possibly aid the Tribe in its control of the spruce bark beetle.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the proposed pilot control project is approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is authorized to sign the necessary documents on behalf of the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on March 3, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
