

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Dr. Roger Shenkel is leaving the U. S. Public Health Service facility, Whiteriver, Arizona, and
- WHEREAS, he has served in an outstanding manner as Director of said facilities, and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Gary H. Spivey has proven that he has outstanding ability in community medicine and in administration, and
- WHEREAS, it is the council's judgment that he is deeply devoted to improving the health standards of the White Mountain Apache people, and
- WHEREAS, he has served as a Commissioned Medical Officer of the Fort Apache Indian Health Service since July, 1970, and
- WHEREAS, he has not had a great deal of experience dealing with the Apache Indian people, but intends to remain in Whiteriver, and
- WHEREAS, the council feels that experience is of vital importance in the administration of the health program for Indian people.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe unanimously endorses the appointment of Dr. Gary H. Spivey as Director of the U. S. Public Health Service, Whiteriver, Arizona to fill the vacancy caused by the leaving by Dr. Roger Shenkel.

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
