

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is an abnormally high fire danger this year, and
WHEREAS, the number of fires through the recreational uses of the forests
have been increasing over the past years, and
WHEREAS, the Recreation Manager and the Forestry Branches have developed
a partial fire closure of the reservation, and
WHEREAS, timing of this closure is very critical and will depend on
weather conditions.

BE IT RESOLVED that in the future the (Chairman of the Forestry Committee)
is authorized to open or close portions of the reservation to
camping and recreation after consultation and approval of the
Recreation Manager and Forestry.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a fire closure to restrict areas of recreation
camping and travel be enforced.

The foregoing resolution was on April 14, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of
8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of
the Amended Constitution and by-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe
June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958,
pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
