FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, there are overcrowded conditions in the Cibecue School and the John F. Kennedy School, and


WHEREAS, our most important resource is our Indian children, and

WHEREAS, without sufficient classroom space to educate our children, they shall be neglected.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent, the Area Director and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs are hereby requested to use all of their available resources to secure sufficient financing to construct two classrooms and two living quarters at the Cibecue School and one classroom and one housing unit at the John F. Kennedy School in Cedar Creek, Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on May 5, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
