

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is a question on how logging in the spruce-timber type affects water quality, and

WHEREAS, the University of Arizona has proposed a study project in the Reservation Creek area that may aid in developing logging techniques to minimize deterioration of water quality, and


WHEREAS, this study has been reviewed by the Forestry Committee and they recommend that permission be granted to conduct it.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe endorses this project and the University of Arizona researchers will be able to conduct this project on Effects of Logging on Stream Temperature and Suspended Sediment in Spruce - Fir type in Reservation Creek area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the University of Arizona researchers are given permission to camp at Reservation Lake and to carry fire arms for protection against rabid animals.

The foregoing resolution was on May 5, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
