

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there are a number of new roads in the spruce-fir timber stands on the reservation, and

WHEREAS, there is a need to close these roads to travel by the general public in order to reduce the risk of fire, protect wild life and to protect the road bed, and

WHEREAS, this has been reviewed by the Forestry Committee and they recommend that these roads be closed.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Branch of Forestry is authorized to construct gates to close these areas to travel by the general public.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Game Wardens are requested to assist in enforcing this road closure.

The foregoing resolution was on May 5, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
