

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to cooperate with the Arizona Highway Department in the construction and improvement of State Route 273 from State Highway 73 to the Apache National Forest boundary, and

WHEREAS, the improvement of State Route 273 will be of great benefit to the Sunrise Park Resort Complex, and


WHEREAS, the Arizona Highway Department has requested a gratuitous Sand and Gravel Permit.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman and Superintendent are hereby authorized and directed to issue a gratuitous Sand and Gravel Permit to the Arizona Highway Department covering a pit consisting of approximately 20 acres located in the S $\frac{1}{2}$  SE $\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 7, T.7N., R.27E., G&SRM.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this permit shall expire at the time the project is completed.

The foregoing resolution was on June 9, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
