

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, a Business Office Study Committee was appointed in the last Council meeting to interview certain qualified firms to make a study of the Business Office, and

WHEREAS, the Study Committee has submitted inquiries to Ernst and Ernst and Arthur Young and Company, and

WHEREAS, Arthur Young and Company has proposed a very in depth study of the operations of the Business Office at a cost of not to exceed \$10,000.00, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that the firm of Arthur Young and Company should be employed to make this much needed study.

BE IT RESOLVED that there is hereby appropriated from funds on deposit with the U. S. Government, the sum of \$10,000.00 to defray the maximum cost of making an in depth study of the Business Office operations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Joe Driscoll, Bureau of Indian Affairs, is hereby requested to participate in and act as liaison for the White Mountain Apache Tribe in the conducting of the study.

The foregoing resolution was on June 9, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 2 abst. 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
