

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
POINT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is vitally interested in and concerned with the development of the children of the reservation, and

WHEREAS, this interest and concern is one of the most important parts of programs for Apache youths for summer work experience, and


WHEREAS, a number of high school students do not qualify by standards according to criteria established by Federal Agencies to participate in federally sponsored programs, and

WHEREAS, these applicants are not always of extreme poverty but all deserve guidance, counselling and employment to continue their education.

BE IT RESOLVED that a program be set up for the fifteen remaining applicants at the rate of \$1.60 per hour for twenty-three hour week for ten weeks.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the total sum of \$6,072.00 be appropriated from Contingency Account for salaries and ten per cent (10%) fringe benefits.

The foregoing resolution was on June 22, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
