

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Black River Forest Fire burned approximately 12,000 acres on both the San Carlos and Fort Apache Indian Reservations, and

WHEREAS, the San Carlos Indian Tribe has requested permission from the White Mountain Apache Tribe to improve and extend the existing fishing road between the Ten of Diamonds and MacDonald Cabin a length of approximately four (4) miles, and

WHEREAS, it is always the desire of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to cooperate with the San Carlos Apaches.


BE IT RESOLVED that permission is hereby granted to San Carlos Apache Tribe to improve and extend the present fishing road between the Ten of Diamonds and MacDonald Cabin a length of approximately four (4) miles.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there is hereby assess the sum of \$20.00 per thousand board feet of timber which is or might be necessary to cut in order to improve and extend said road.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent insists that after logging operations are completed that the road on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation side, which was extended or improved, be seeded with grass and trees replanted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent is further requested to see that the road is sufficiently blocked after the timber is harvested to prevent usage thereof by vehicular travel.

The foregoing resolution was on August 4, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
