

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is our understanding that the Indian Business Development Fund (IBDF) will not be available this year, possibly because of lack of appropriate legislation, and

WHEREAS, the Indian Business Development Fund has been one of the most popular Bureau of Indian Affairs programs, with far-reaching economic and social effects.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to strongly recommend to the Secretary of the Interior and to the U. S. Congress that the Indian Business Development Fund program be reinstated, and increased in size, as soon as possible to allow for continuing development of individual Indian entrepreneurship.

The foregoing resolution was on August 4, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1953, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
