

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the lowest proposed logging costs to log the timber from the White Springs Fire Salvage Logging Unit and other fire salvage sales from the northwestern and southwestern units of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation into the Fort Apache Timber Company Mill at Whiteriver have far exceeded expectations, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Tribal Council to have this fire damaged and destroyed timber processed by the Fort Apache Timber Company at Whiteriver, since the mill at Cibecue has more fire damaged and destroyed timber under contract than it can possibly manufacture.

BE IT RESOLVED that the recommended stumpage rate for the fire damaged and destroyed timber to be cut on the White Springs Fire Salvage Logging Unit as established by Resolution No. 71-123 on August 4, 1971, be amended to read "Rates to be established at ten percent (10%) of gross sales less purchased lumber".

The foregoing resolution was on August 11, 1971, during a Special Tribal Council Meeting, duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
