

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is a need to locate a feasible site for the to be constructed Cibecue Sawmill, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hal Butler, Manager of the Fort Apache Timber Company recommended a site of approximately six tenths of a mile from the existing sawmill at Cibecue, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wants all parties involved to inspect the site.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Forestry Committee, together with Paul Amos, Jr., Livestock Manager, Raymus Albert, Land Board Chairman and Nelson Lupe, Sr., and Homer Beatty, Councilmen from Cibecue visit the site chosen by Mr. Hal Butler and either approve or disapprove said site.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these same persons, if they disapprove the site selected by Mr. Butler, are authorized to find a different site upon which to locate the new Cibecue Sawmill.

The foregoing resolution was on September 21, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
